Clarence Majors Rogers, 69, of Cleveland, formerly of Bowling Green, died Oct. 7, 2009, at Hospice Western Reserve Hospital in Cleveland. The Scott Haven, Pa., native was born March 26, 1940. He was baptized at New Hope Baptist Church in Scott Haven at the age of 10. He attended elementary school in Scott Haven and later joined the Army, where he actively served for

seven years. He later moved to Cleveland and worked as a professional boxer and business owner, where he sold tires to trucking companies and Greyhound Bus Lines. He was a member of the Masonic Order, where he served as secretary for the State of Ohio Masons. He later moved to New York, where he was manager of Produce Warehouse. Upon retirement, Clarence moved to Richmond, Va., and lived in Bowling Green prior to moving back to Cleveland. He was a son of the late Early Davis and Helen Brown Rodgers and Mary Rodgers. He was preceded in death by brothers and sisters, Early Lee Rogers, Marion Brown and Geraldine and Bud Willis; and a sister-in-law, Joan Cosby Rodgers. Memorial service is at 1 p.m. Saturday at Rock Hill Baptist Church in Mechanicsville, Va. Cremation was chosen and inurnment will be in Ohio Western Reserve National Cemetery in Rittman, Ohio.
